Probability of choosing 2nd chocobar = $3/7$. Probability of choosing 1 icecream out of a total of 6 = $4/6 = 2/3$. So the final probability of choosing 2 chocobars and 1 icecream = $1/2 * 3/7 * 2/3 = 1/7$.
